PCYC –The PCYC is putting air conditioning into the large hall, which will enable the room to be utilised more effectively throughout the year

Salvation Army – Funds will be utilised towards a Children’s Camp rather similar to last year

Lifeline – Funds will be used to assist volunteers financially where they do not have the funds for the training and or travel involved. 11 out of 15 have passed their training in Tamworth and Armidale has 18 new recruits.
