PAUL HARRIS FELLOW **Jenny Barlow**

Boggabri farmer, teacher and hyperthermia (radiowave) cancer treatment advocate, Jenny Barlow, was recently awarded Paul Harris Fellow recognition by the Rotary Club of Guunedah West.

Jenny has been campaigning for the introduction of hyperthermia treatment in Australian public hospitals for the last five years and has travelled the world (mostly at her own expense) gathering information and building networks with health professionals. Hyperthermia has been used extensively throughout Europe, the USA and India for the past three decades, but Australia currently only

has one private clinic in Western Australia.

Jenny has had some break through with her crusade in that Professor Michael Jackson, Head of Oncology and Radiation at Prince of Wales is keen to commence delivery of the treatment at Prince of Wales.

Professor Jackson also has travelled overseas, visiting clinics and meeting with health professionals to learn more about the treatment and how to administer it. Funds are now being raised to purchase the \$400,000.00 machine for Prince of Wales.

Most of you will remember Jenny speaking at our Club approximately five years ago.
