## **GUEST SPEAKER - James Treloar 'Life After Mayor'**



**Introduced by Annette Arthur and thanked by Phil Penman**

Former Mayor of Tamworth for 15 years, Cr James Treloar is no stranger to First Light Rotary - he was present at the Charter of the Club 21 years ago in the capacity of Deputy Mayor.

'Life after Mayor' has been much quieter for James as far as the mobile phone goes - he can now even get to service the tractor with his son without the phone ringing.

The role of Deputy Mayor and Mayor was part of the children's life with their father attending meetings and civic functions.

James is now paying close attention to his lucerne farm and catching up on farm jobs. When Mayor, appointments didn't always line up with the weather map!

James has kept some roles within Council, one of which is spokesperson for Evocities. This project involves seven inland cities getting together to shift the focus from the Coast and to encourage capital city residents to make the move to an Evocity and invest in the opportunities the cities have to offer.

An Australian first, seven of NSW's leading cities have united to form the Evocities campaign and encourage people to live, work and invest in an Evocity. The seven cities are Albury, Wagga Wagga, Bathurst, Orange, Dubbo, Tamworth and Armidale.

Each of the seven cities has dedicated resources and funding to the campaign and has in turn secured Federal funding as well as support from the NSW State Government and Corporate Sponsors.

The Evocity name was coined because the cities are centres of Energy Vision and Opportunity.

**Evocity is not a sea change, not a tree change but a CITY CHANGE.**

Part of the Evocities role is to lobby for infrastructure and growth. James gave an interesting overview of NBN and how the Evocities have combined to push for connections and have also combined to present a united plan, rather than NBN Co having to deal with seven different council plans, requirements, etc.

Concluding his very interesting and informative address, James said that 'life after Mayor is enjoyable'.
