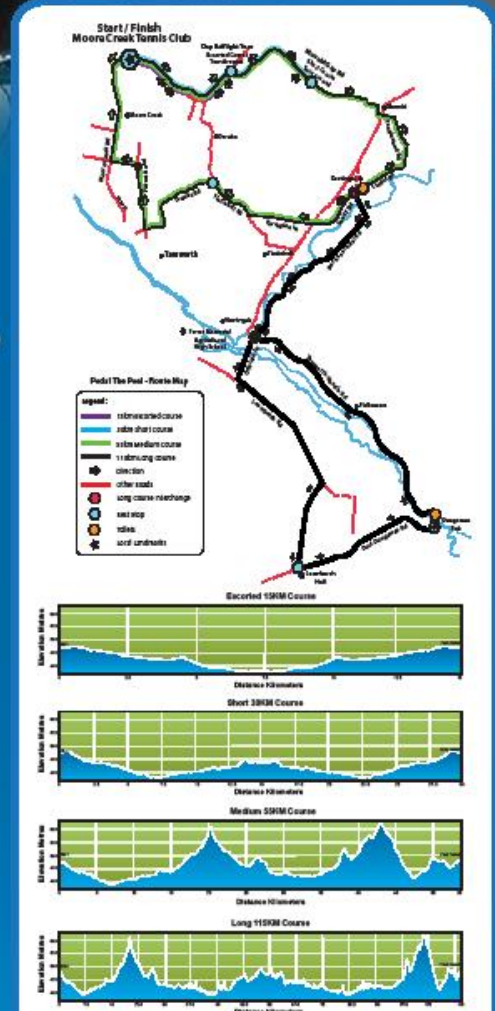
This fun cycling challenge will start and finish at the Moore Creek Tennis Club on Moore Creek Road, Tamworth.
