TREASURER'S REPORT 2014 – 2015

The 2014-15 year has been a solid year for the Club from a financial perspective. Following the final disbursements made at our June Board meeting, the Club will have donated *\$50,445.36* for the year to the following organizations:

The net profit for the year will be \$6,918 with outstanding accounts receivable at \$3,400 and creditors of an estimated \$8,500 (Science and Engineering and Career's Expo).

The Club remains in a very strong financial position with funds of over \$28,000 invested for our PNG project and an additional \$4,563 available to assist with future Science and Engineering events. A further \$1,000 has been set aside for the Club Person of the Year choice of charity.

The Club's main administration account will have a balance around \$18,000 for the incoming Board, notwithstanding the outstanding accounts.

Once again the main contributors to the fundraising activities have been the Pedal the Peel cycle event, the golf trips and the Santa Pub Crawl. Through these three activities, the Club was able to disburse over \$40,000 during the year to worthy charities.

Additionally, the Club's efforts with running the bar at Tamworth Magpies home games and the Post Office hotel raffles each Friday night have together generated over \$11,000 for the year. The Club would like to recognise the generous support that Andrew Coutts of the the Post Office Hotel has given to the Club with his on-going support of these raffles, not only this year but since their inception over the last 3-4 years.

Our Fine Sergeant, James Treloar, found that being funny and extracting money first thing in the morning is a lot harder than running a Council meeting! Nonetheless, he extracted \$7,623.51 during the year with a further \$1,229.40 being contributed from fines gathered on the recent golf trips. The Club made a contribution of \$4,000 from the fine income

to Rotary Foundation with a further \$4,000 being transferred to the Club's own Foundation.

Pressures continue from a costing perspective on the Club's involvement in both the Science and Engineering Challenge and Career's Expo. Steve Massey co-ordinated a very successful S&E Challenge and the Club acknowledges the generous contributions from the following:

We are also grateful for the continued association and assistance from the University of Newcastle co-hosting this event.

The First Light Foundation Account currently has a balance of \$77,102.16. This will increase by a further \$2,524.25 on July 4, 2015 when interest is credited and a further \$4,000 is transferred from this year's activities. This will bring the balance of the Foundation account to **\$83,626.41 by July 4**, 2015 at which time further investment decisions will be required.

As we approach our goal of \$100,000, it is important for the Club to discuss the strategy for the Foundation moving forward. We are clearly in a low interest rate environment with rates for the coming year likely to be no better than 2.5%. With these funds and that of the PNG account, the Club has well in excess of \$110,000 invested at rates that do not cover current inflation rates.

A significant decision was made by the Finance Committee during the year to move to the MYOB Essentials accounting package which allows all transactions to be regularly downloaded from our banking activities directly to our accounting software. This has made the job of Treasurer less onerous and lessened the likelihood of less errors in the allocation of monies during the year. In undertaking this transition and preparation of our BAS returns, I would like to thank both Dennis Maunder and Bec Davis of Hancocks Accounting for their assistance.

Finally, I would like to thank those who have assisted me in the role of Treasurer during the year, especially those who still use those wonderful things called cheques.

Australian Rotary Health

Australian Rotary Health (ARH) has a role in promoting research in mental health as well as awareness of mental health issues in our communities. "Hat Day" is an ARH initiative to reduce the stigma associated with mental health. "Hat Day" was incorporated into our Rotary meeting on 8/10/14 & was well supported.

NE Orthopaedic Outreach to PNG

This continues to be an ongoing program supported by our club. Rob Sharpe took a small group to Rabaul in September for a week's operation as well as a second trip during the Christmas/New year period. This project is currently being reviewed due to the PNG Government decision to overhaul the health facilities at Rabaul & Kokopo. This may result in PNG Government financing refurbishment of St Mary's Hospital at Vanopoe. The funding that has been established & earmarked by our club is currently being held until this review is complete. This project will continue to be supported in various forms and monitored for action once the PNG government shows their intentions. This area was also subject to volcanic & earthquake tremor activity this year causing concern for the local community. Thank you to my committees for their assistance this year.
