- Reiko Izumi Our YEP student from Toyama Japan has been a delight. I recently had the privilege of Skyping into her Rotary Club in Japan and met her parents and the Club President. They all expressed gratitude to us for hosting Reiko and sent their wishes from Toyama.
- Club Foundation Review The panel convened and considered all members feedback and put forward a unanimous
 recommendation for the Club Foundation to stay as is. The board then ratified this recommendation and I have
 now asked the club to consider this. It is my opinion that we run a thorough process that needs to be respected.
- PNG St Mary's Hospital. Diane Ford reported that the upgrade to the hospital has now been completed which
