

Debra Bath talked to us about Motor Neurone Disease. Since her husband Daryl was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease a close friend of Daryl, Graham Yeo, was also diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease. A chilling fact that the prevalence of Motor Neurone Disease was 1 in 500 not so long ago - it is now 1 in 280 persons.





Debra recently completed a fundraiser for Motor Neurone Disease by successfully walking the Kokoda Track and raising some \$20,000 for research.

President Graham present Debra a cheque for \$1,500 from the Club towards her Motor Neurone Disease fundraising.

Andrew Beer – Presented a very polished personal profile. Given the shortness of time he used a power point presentation to condense his life into the time available. Features of Andrew's presentation included his early childhood through to adolescence, school, sporting achievements, love, marriage to the beautiful Natasha and his three lovely children. His career with the ANZ Bank, coaching his son's soccer team, raising his
