Youth In Search-

### Malcolm McPherson, Amiee Caulfield, Eilish O'Shea

Mal has been involved in Youth in search since 1999.

First camp was in 2000. Mal got sick of people coming through the court system like a revolving door. Jail was often better than the conditions at to home.

### Eilish O'Shea

Youth in search is for children from 14 - 18 years old. Aim is to get children out of their bucket of shit. Program was founded in 1985. 30,000 youth have been helped since it started. A former Calrossy girl, Eilish got involved after being asked by Mal. Eilish is a Support worker who meets once a week with 5 people in Armidale One of her clients had been sexually assaulted by her father from 5 years old. One her other clients had passed away in March this year. Forgiveness can



change your life for ever. Youth In search has changed Elish life forever Be the change you wish to see in the world

### **Aimee Caulfield**



Aimee lived in a house of domestic violence. If there was a day when a hole was not punched in a wall, it was an unusual day.Had been sexually assault at 8 years old, attempted suicide at 10 years old. Was always very angry & scared A lady suggested Youth in Search She found that there was other people going through what she was going through After 3 camps, Amiee wanted to become a leader Amiee went through the leadership program to become a leader

and has been the light bulb to other kids going through the same thing. She was certain she would be dead by the time she was 16. After becoming a leader with Youth In Search, she was sexually









assaulted again in 2013. Youth in search got her through. She has finished high school. She has got the job she has wanted since she was 9 years. She wouldn't be here if it wasn't for youth in search. Paul Stevenson stated that this is a small sample of what these kids go through and why they are so passionate about helping them.





### Mal McPherson.

Rotary & Lions donate to Youth in Search. Youth in Search has received funding of over \$500,000 since 2000 – Comparison - It costs \$300,000 to keep a young person in jail.

90% of kids stop committing crimes after attended the camp A lot of these kids go through the school system and are disruptive Kids that are disruptive outside jail are well behaved in jail as it is a structured environment. They do 8 camps per year. Rotary District 9650 support Youth In Search Rate of youth suicide is huge If the youth suicide numbers was a death on road statistic, there would be a community outcry. A copy of Eilish's speech is attached.

A cheque for Youth Insearch of \$5,000 was donated and the Club has donated \$13,000 for the 2015 / 2016 year.
