Brodie Shields- Birth of the Internet in Tamworth


- Our member Brodie Shields was the guest speaker and spoke enthusiastically on the introduction of the Internet to Tamworth 20 years ago. Brodie believes Tamworth was the first regional area to embrace the Internet.
- Brodie and others including Bob Kirchner, Derek Duncan and a fellow called Dave introduced the Internet originally to Tamworth. Before long, North-West Internet took on additional shareholders.
- Brodie explained technical terms such as Internet Service Provider (ISP) the ISDN line, Point of Presence (POP), modems and rotary dialler.
- The whole business was a steep learning curve for all concerned. Eventually, the business also expanded into Armidale.
- Soon there was competition in Tamworth from Ozemail, TPG and Bigpond .
- Brodie spoke about the pioneering days of being able to read the newspaper over the Internet and download information on current affairs.
- Brodie and his co-founders could see the power of the Internet in such diverse areas as crime prevention and also airline bookings.
- The whole pioneering process of establishing and running a company in a new business area was challenging, but Brodie enjoyed it immensely and learned a lot.
- Eventually Microplex took over the assets of the local company and North-West Internet was wound up.
