3. Use antivirus software and update it every time there is an update which could be daily.

Chris from Tamworth IT solutions spoke about Malwares, system vulnerabilities, recovery options and other threats. In summary:

- Malwares are any malicious activity that may disrupt computers, gather information, gain access or display unwanted advertising.
- Look out for vectors such as email attachments including .zip, .doc or .xls



- Software vulnerabilities in software may include Java, Flash, OS version. Be especially cautious as Qicktime (un-install it straight away!)
- Ensure you have strong passwords,
- Malicious emails, look out for- generically addressed emails, from a personal email service, grammatical errors or spelling mistakes, links that just look strange when you hover over them,
- NEVER pay out for recovery!

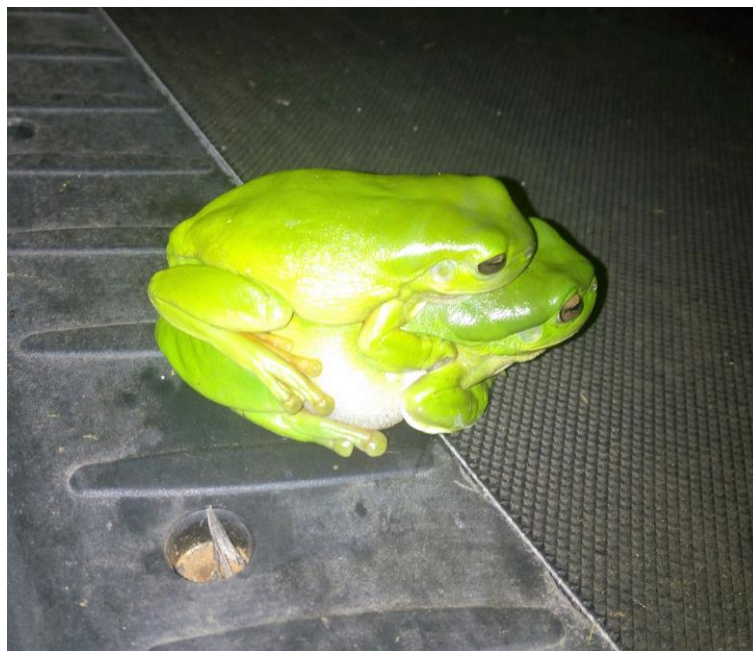
NOVEMBER IS ROTARY FOUNDATION MONTH

A History of the Rotary Foundation

In 1917, RI President Arch C. Klumph proposed that an endowment be set up “for the purpose of doing good in the world”. The first donation in 1917 was for \$26.50. By 1928 the endowment fund had grown to more than US\$5000. It was renamed the Rotary Foundation and became a distinct entity within Rotary International. Five trustees, including Klumph, were appointed to “hold, invest, manage and administer all of its property”. In 1930 the Foundation made its first grant of \$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children.

The Great Depression and World War II both slowed the growth of the Foundation. However, the need for lasting world peace again generated interest in its development. After Rotary’s founder Paul P Harris died in 1947, contributions began pouring into Rotary International and the Paul Harris Memorial Fund was created to build the Foundation. The following is a short list of when some of the Foundation projects were commenced.
