


**District conference-** 24<sup>th</sup>-26<sup>th</sup> March 2017 at Laurieton

Thank you to all those who will be assisting with those events.


Whilst they are not events where we raise money, Rotary is not about raising money on every event. Rotary is about doing good in our communities in lots of different ways.
