The facility hosts students from Nursing, radiation science, social science, dietetics, pharmacy, medicine, speech pathology and occupational therapy.

About half their students are studying medicine in 4th/5th years while the other half are a combination of nursing and allied health.

Half of the Junior Medical Officers at the Tamworth Rural Referral Hospital are from this program showing that many students who study here get training positions here.

Outside of Tamworth, UON has major training sites in Moree, Armidale, Coffs Harbour and Port Macquarie.

All of the lecturers are also working in their field (Physicians, nurses, dieticians etc) and live in Tamworth so the university has quite a local presence.




ROTARY'S TARGET CHALLENGE to
