

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

What an inspirational meeting. It was one of those meetings where you could be rightly and justly proud to be a Rotarian by contributing to make the world a better place.

It was fantastic to see Graeme Dooley returning to Rotary after his illness.

The Pedal The Peel - Cycling Challenge financial results were disclosed with the joint clubs of First Light and Sunrise giving away \$34,000.00. \$17,000.00 to Youth Insearch, \$5,000.00 to Banksia Mental Health at the Hospital, \$4,000.00 to Billabong Clubhouse, \$4,000.00 to Headspace and \$4,000.00 to Batyr. That is more than double the last year's efforts.

It was a great and productive joint venture with the Sunrise Club.

At last week's Board meeting, the current board and incoming board made decisions to donate another \$51,000.00, in addition to donations already made to date.

Donations will be set out in my annual changeover report.

That means for the year, our Club has been involved in giving financial donations exceeding \$107,000.00.

Since the club was chartered, the Club has donated more than a million dollars to making the world a better place and serving our communities.

Whilst that financial commitment is substantial, we also need to consider the value of the many Rotary programs particularly youth programs such as the Science and Engineering Challenge, the Careers Expo, RYLA, the many RYAG Programs and other hands on projects. The value is difficult to quantify but in terms of the benefit to the community, it is immense.

A case in point of course is our RYLA program.


