



Brian Logan on a fabulous effort by feeding the starving riders and workers BRAVO Brian Thompson on the safe arrival of Thomas. A little man for Sarah.

Our Guest was **Barry Harley** from TRC who told us about the **Toyota Country Music Festival** which began in Tamworth in the late 1960s when radio audiences were declining. A special "clear channel" radio signal was available and Hoedown was introduced and artists were sponsored by 2TM.

In 1969 Tamworth was proclaimed Country Music Capital 1973 the first Golden Guitar Awards were staged.

Now in 2018 there are 2800 scheduled events; over 700 artists performing in over 100 venues; 430 registered buskers; almost 20,000 positive media reports and netting \$24,694,612. The age of visitors is decreasing with many families attending.

Visitors; 1/3 are locals; 1/3 NSW state (1/4 from Hunter & ¼ from Sydney); 1/3 interstate (1/2 Queensland & 1/3 from Victoria). 1/3 people come for the 10 days.

40% of people stay in campsites. They come for the atmosphere and to see new country acts. The free concerts are very important

Local sporting groups gain \$61,000.

Toyota Star Maker -106.1 is beamed live from Tamworth Landcruiser Country.

Golden Guitar Awards Australia

There is an income for Tamworth of \$50 million from 40,000 visitors.
