Established originally from a group around Hallsville and Moore Creek to raise funds to assist people with cancer, following the suffering of one of the founders' children (Wendy Hetherington).


Through quilting over a glass of sherry and some camps and quilt shows, the group was able to raise over \$300,000 to assist people with cancer.
