FOUNDATION REPORT: Thank you to Dennis Maunder for organising audit.

Discussion and information re foundation answered by David Hinwood:

- Current trustees: David Hinwood, Michael O'Connor, Deb Barnes, with one new replacement annually.
- Investment advisory committee with expertise in this area to make recommendations to the trustees on investment strategies, has been approved by the board as per motion on 8th September: "The board supports the implementation of an investment committee to give investment advice to the trustees of the trust fund." Phil Penman, John Worldon and Laurie Hearne have accepted these positions.
- David reiterated the following information which was discussed at the September board meeting: The Foundation trust has approximately \$60,000 \$65,000 in capital in the fund which is currently not accessible for expenditure according to the trust deed. There is around \$35,000 of accessible growth funds that can be utilised, by the board applying to the trustees for approval to expend. The investment is reviewed annually.
- David advised that an honorary solicitor is currently adjusting the trustee provisions and that an investment committee meeting will happen shortly.

1. Rotary Lodge Update – Deb Barnes

Hunter New England Health has been negotiating with Rotary re the rebuilding of Rotary Lodge. Banksia, which was not custom built, is no longer deemed to be viable or safe for patients, so a new 34-bed unit is to be built on the site of the current Rotary Lodge. \$1million has been allocated by HNE Health to rebuild a new Rotary Lodge comprising 4 lodges, each with its own kitchen, for the carers of patients who live > 100km from Tamworth. When Syd came back from National Service he operated a poultry farm. He also had a great interest in car racing and raced at Orange, Bathurst, Warwick Farm and Katoomba. This hobby brought him great joy and pleasure.

Syd was given an Order of Australia for his charity work, particularly his involvement with the Outback Car Trek which raises money for the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

He has been involved for 25 years with this fundraising scheme, and in addition, he also went on the Variety Club Bash twice.

Syd had a special car, a Ford Galaxy, which he purchased for \$3000. He used this car on the Outback Car Trek.

Syd had a long career in the pyrotechnics business. He started doing fireworks at the Royal Melbourne Show in 1957 and went on to do the fireworks there for the next 40 years.




