Congratulations are in order for Brett on becoming a grandad!



Guess Speaker **Emma Fuller** from Homes North





A Huge Thank you from Rotarian Louise Mathews for the work Emma and Homes North do in our community. Thank you

Our guest speaker this week was Emma Fuller who is a director of Youth Services at Homes North in Tamworth which is a not-for-profit community housing and support service for disadvantaged people in our community.

Homes North business is about connecting people and places, creating new opportunities and taking a place-based approach to advocate for, coordinate and partner with the services that people in our community need.

Homes North has been operating in the North-West and New England areas for over 30 years and provides hosing for around 2,000 people. Their integrated approach to housing includes community and consumer involvement with consideration of necessary facilities, amenities, opportunities and community supports.

Homes North works to achieve a just and equitable distribution and access to housing resources in NSW, participating in planning and implementation of housing policies at all levels of government to develop and expand community based non-profit housing programmes.

The primary objectives of Homes North are as follows:

- to work for the prevention of the further loss of accommodation for low income earners and the associated escalation in accommodation costs which is causing dispossession and displacement of these people
- to raise public awareness and understanding of the social contexts within which people become homeless or poorly housed
- to encourage the involvement of tenants in the management of their own housing
- focus on the housing needs of those population groups discriminated against in the private rental market and/or excluded from other public housing programmes.

VISITOR ASSIST

To ensure any visitors to the Club are made welcome by introducing yourself to them and other members and guests of our Club. **To also include them in fellowship before and, where possible, introduce them to the President**, make sure they are included with several members for breakfast and are not left on their own.

Need to be in attendance from 6.30 am

INTRODUCTION
