Rotary Quest Speaker – Janine Duncan.

How did she end up selling sheds in Tamworth for 35 Years?

Janine left school in 1968 and worked in a Solicitors firm for 3 years and then got the travel bug. Janine then took a long & winding adventurous trip to the UK where she worked mainly in the entertainment industry. Then the compulsory broken heart.

Then back home to Perth Australia in 1976 to open first pizza home delivery business that went pear shaped. She met her husband in Perth, then moved to Brisbane. Got a job as a Complaints Officer. Was promoted and had to work with 2 gay guys that did not get it on anymore. Janine's husband, Vic wanted to move to the country. Janine would have gone anywhere to get away from the humidity, the in-laws, and complaints.

In 1981, they bought land in Tintinhull. Vic realized that he needed to work for himself. He started work as a brickie at the Kmart site in Gunnedah and Janine became Vic's brickies laborer. At the end of the day, Janine would flop in the shower from shear exhaustion. Not rocket science to work out why she got pregnant with their son Mathew. Vic was the only brickie to get his laborer pregnant.

In 1982 they moved to Tintinhull. Janine was pregnant while they were building their little house. She worked from home with 2 babies with Vic building pools.

Moved to Nemingha in 1985.

Opened Backyard shop on the corner of White & Marius Street in 1987. They gathered a great team who helped grow the business.

2002 threw them a curve ball. Vic was diagnosed with Parkinson. After 2 shoulder reconstructions for Vic, he had retire from work in 2004 at 54 years and Janine had to take over to run the business.

In 2010, their son Rob became a partner in the business.

In 2011. They bought their building at auction.

In June 2011, Vic had Deep Brain Stimulation operation where doctors drilled 14mm holes into his head. This provided 5 years of improved quality of life.

There is 1,000 people living with Parkinson in Australia. 37 new diagnose per day. Herbicides, chemicals, heavy metals, and stress is believed to contribute to Parkinson disease.

Janine is in her 70th year this year. Life is never boring.




