

Bowel Cancer Facts

- 2nd Biggest Cancer Killer
- Effects all age groups
- 1 in 12 people will develop bowel cancer in their lifetime
- If detected early can be successfully treated in 90% of cases
- · Of those diagnosed: 55% male; 45% female
- 2016: 17,052 new cases; 4,094 deaths from bowel cancer in 2016

Bowel Cancer Symptoms

- · Bleeding in the stool or on the toilet paper
- Change in bowel habit
- · Unexplained abdominal pain
- Weight loss
- · Loss of appetite
- · Feeling more tired than normal
- Polyps:
 - Cause unknown and often there are no symptoms
 - Clump of cells less than 1/4 inch to several inches in diameter
 - · Arise from the lining of the bowel wall
 - · Untreated Can turn to Cancer
 - Regular Screening is Required, buy a kit today.




