Background on Noelene Bosworth

Good Morning, my name is Noelene Bosworth, I am the director of the Tamworth Regional Conservatorium of Music. Thank you for inviting me along this morning to speak to you all about our 'Con'!

I have been working at the Conservatorium now for 26 years. I applied to be the Brass Teacher at the end of 1994. I was interviewed by the late Derek Taylor and got the position and started at the beginning of term 1, 1995. Not long after I came to town I met Bill Forrest, not long after meeting Bill he nominated me to attend the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards. I was honoured to have the opportunity to improve my leadership skills. I returned from the RYLA camp in Armidale and spoke at a Rotary Meeting. I thanked your organisation then and all these years later I would like again to express my gratitude for that opportunity given to me. Look where I am today! It was 8 years ago I became the Program Manager for the Conservatorium and 6 years ago I interviewed for my current position of Director. I still teach about 25 students, because I am passionate about giving students, of all ages, the opportunity to learn and progress on a brass instrument. I have loved playing (and still love) brass instruments since I was 7 years old. Teaching music would have to be one of the most rewarding and inspiring careers.

The Tamworth Regional Conservatorium of Music is one of 17 Regional Conservatoriums in NSW. We provide instrumental and vocal tuition to approximately 1000 students of all ages in the community of Tamworth and the region. Our youngest students now are babies from 3 months in our mums and bubs Early Childhood classes. Our Early Childhood classes cater for children up to 5 or 6 years of age. The program encourages a positive attitude to music, provides opportunities for parents to share and enjoy music with their child, develops the child's understanding of the basic concepts of music, encourages their development through the use of songs, games, listening, dance and percussion instruments and prepares the child for learning a musical instrument.
