Guest Speaker Notes

Summary Of talk by Courtney Priestley RCTFL 20th July 2022

- Born in New Zealand and moved with her family to Australia when she was 2 years old. Is the youngest of 3 children. Mum is from Gunnedah and Dad from Yorkshire in England and they met as teenagers when both were playing in the Brass Band in Gunnedah. Parents now live in Orange. Is only 100% Kiwi when Rugby Union is on!
- Music a big part of her life and has been playing the piano since 5 years of age.
- Sport was a part of life with her main activity being soccer refereeing which she did quite competitively. She ended up training new incoming referees for a few years.
- Worked at the Electrolux factory in Orange for the time between High School and University, making fridge parts.
- Studied at the University of New South Wales, doing a 5-year, double degree of a Bachelor of Advanced Science majoring in Vision Science and a masters of Clinical Optometry.
- In her 3rd year at Uni, went on a group tour of Europe
- In her 4th year at Uni, she did a 2 week placement in Tamworth with Paul Harvey Optometry, during which time he offered her a job after graduating, which she accepted.
- In her 5th and final year at Uni she did a 4 week preceptorship in the UK. Two incredible weeks were in a very modern practice in Northampton that had been operating since the mid 1800's. Then a week in Nottingham and a week in Glasgow. It was in Scotland that the love of bush walking or hiking was born.
- Moved to Tamworth at the end of 2018 and was hit with 40 43 degree days so didn't leave the house until at least 6pm
- Has been using bush walking to explore areas of country near and far with the most challenging hike to date, called 'The Castle in the Budawangs' a 11km hike that reviews said will take 12 hours to complete. She retired home after 9 hours and 9.5 kms. This hike is found down the south coast, through the Blue Mountains.


