

Why is it so difficult for fathers to find community?

Three years ago, Davaanyam Gongorjav, a young father living in Erdenet, Mongolia, found himself raising two children alone after tragically losing his wife to cancer. With no job and no child care, he faced a crisis of confidence as a father.

And it turns out he was not alone— there were dozens of single fathers in Erdenet facing similar challenges. Jennifer Scott, an Australian Rotary member, heard word of these fathers and, with a group of colleagues, organized a workshop for nearly two dozen single fathers, supported by a global grant from Rotary.

Guest Speaker Notes – Legacy

Our club was pleased to hear from Greg Roese, representing Legacy.

Legacy is an iconic Australian charity that was established in 1923 and founded on a promise made from one digger to another – to "look after the missus and the kids" - in modern parlance - Helping veteran's families carry on with their lives after the loss or injury of a loved one who has served in our armed forces.

To this day, almost 100 years on, Legacy upholds their promise- supporting 43,000 beneficiaries - partners and children - of veterans across Australia. Of these 43,000, support is given to 40,185 widows and widowers, 1,282 children, and 1,107 beneficiaries with disabilities. Financial contributions total \$16M, and \$19.3M of volunteering hours (value) - representing a substantial, but still underfunded service to our veterans. Further help from the government and donations from our communities are always appreciated.

Next year, on ANZAC day 2023, The Legacy Torch Relay will depart Pozieres France. The relay will travel through London England, where it will continue to tour throughout Australia before arriving in Tamworth on July 4th 2023. Within Tamworth, the 32 torch bearers will travel 13km through town from AELEC, Golden Guitar, and the St Edwards Memorial Bell Tower, Bicentennial Park, and ANZAC park. Finishing point will be the Town Hall, for the lighting of a commemorative caldron.

Community support for Legacy can be provided by attending the events in person, volunteering time towards the events, or corporate sponsorship opportunities for the TJC Legacy Race Day.

Many thanks to Greg for sharing with us his stories of the great work Legacy does for our veterans.
