Guest Speaker Notes – Tamworth Regional Astronomy Club

Since its opening, the Tamworth Astronomy Club (TRAC) that manages the Centre has acquired two more very large instruments, currently housed at Moonbi, where TRAC life member and Club Patron Raymond McLaren of Andromeda Engineering has kindly provided his Aerospace Workshop.

One is the Uppsala Southern Schmidt Telescope built for the Uppsala University in Sweden and installed at Siding Spring until donated to TRAC in 2021. The other, and the subject of this article, is the Baker-Nunn Camera (BNC) owned by the University of New South Wales (UNSW) and recently donated to TRAC.

This camera is a United States version of the English Hewitt camera currently in service at the A&SC here in Tamworth. Both were built in the same era and for the same purpose. Commissioned by the Smithsonian Institute in the mid-1950s during the Cold War, 17 of these cameras were designed and built to track missiles and the very early artificial satellites. Twelve were distributed around the world, one being installed at Woomera in South Australia. A further five were built for the US military. After several years of service, the Woomera unit was donated to the Australian National University where it was stored unused for several years, then donated to UNSW and put into service at Siding Spring.

The UNSW undertook a major upgrade to the BNC by replacing the celluloid film system with a digital imaging system, re-shaping the top corrector and field flattening lenses and computer automating the system so that it could be operated remotely by anyone from anywhere. With these modifications, the UNSW renamed the camera the Automated Patrol Telescope (APT).

In 2013, a major bushfire severely damaged the services to the building, and partly damaged the BNC as well, resulting in its de-commissioning. Sadly, it remained untouched for several years until it was donated to TRAC and moved to Tamworth in 2021. Thus began the second lease on life for the BNC.

TRAC has now committed to re-furbishing the APT to a fully functional instrument using the latest technology. Accordingly, a team of TRAC members led by Raymond McLaren with Brodie Shields, Barry Gilbert, John Maude, Peter Best and Phil Betts has been assembled to undertake the project that is expected to run up to two years. The team has been in contact with academics and experts locally and overseas who are taking a keen interest in our progress.

Many hundreds of man-hours and thousands of dollars of donations-in-kind have been expended so far in preliminary work.

The machine is now fully dismantled, the large 34-inch (86 cm) 160kg mirror is being prepared for re-coating and the top lens is being prepared for polishing here in Tamworth with a machine purpose-built for the job by TRAC members. Some major works yet to be done include the design and manufacture of a mounting assembly for the new digital camera cell and the design of an electronic control system so the camera can be computer-controlled.

Once completed, the BNC will be a world-class scientific instrument. In fact, we already have interest from some institutions to lease the camera for their own research. This is a brief history of the BNC and a report on the early progress by TRAC members. The writer intends to publish further articles as the project progresses.

An astronomy club is not just about peering through an eyepiece at some distant star. There are many projects, not as big as this one, that members can be involved with. Further information can be obtained by visiting www.tamworhastronomy.com.au






