Rotary, Peace Corps support Ukrainian refugees

Partnering for Peace is a nonprofit that promotes and supports the collaboration between Rotary members and Returned Peace Corps Volunteers. Through the organization, Kim Dixon, a member of the Rotary Club of Midtown, North Carolina, USA, learned about Friends of Moldova, a group of Returned Peace Corps Volunteers who had opened emergency centers to provide food and basic hygiene supplies to Ukrainian refugees. Dixon worked with both organizations to secure a disaster response grant from The Rotary Foundation which purchased food and supplies for an estimated 2,400 refugees. Guest Speaker Notes – Ben Willis Occ Therapy, Parkinson's Program & Sense Rugby

Tamara Private Hospital which is part of the Ramsay Health Care. The Ramsay Health Care is one of the biggest private health care groups in the world

Tamara was recently the beneficiary of a multi-million dollar grant from Ramsay to upgrade the operation theatres and day surgery waiting rooms. The theatres are up and running now This is very exciting for Tamara and Tamworth as the upgraded facilities will encourage health care professionals and specialist doctors to Tamworth which is what Tamworth really needs.

Ben is an Occupational Therapist, and he did his training at Newcastle University He worked in Newcastle after graduating for a few years. Ben got the travel bun and flew over to London with his now wife who is also an Occupational Therapist. Ben worked for the NHS (National Health Service) and also for some private health care companies.

Ben Came back about a year ago. After the Covid pandemic Tamworth was one of the only towns with 2 jobs going for OT's. They chose Tamworth. It was obvious that country cities lack the range of health car professionals those larger cities take for granted. Tamara is working to bridge that gap with some of the exciting new programs.

Ben spoke about 3 key areas of improvements

First the improvement of the Day Rehabilitation program. This service if for those who are safe to be at home and are below their base line. This service it twice a week session to help them improve their health. A big thing is that patients mostly need to have private health care or able to self-fund funding. Though there are some exceptions.

Second is the Activate Program – This is a program for people who have had a diagnosis of cancer as well as those suffering with Parkinson's. After treatment and chemo people lose a certain degree of independence. Patience are 'cruelly' subjected to intensive exercise over a 10 week program to help them get back to where they were.

The Parkinson program has started at Tamara. Ben is passionate about this condition this was part of his final year project at Uni. Since leaving Uni Ben has worked with a lot of Parkinson patients. Parkinson's is a progressive neurological disease. The program works to get patients back as far as possible to their base line. To prolong their disease and help them to be as safe as possible.

A lot of those with Parkinson suffer from freezing. They find it sometimes hard to start movement and literally freeze. This 10 week program provides intense physiotherapy works on strategies to combat this freezing and get patients going. Each session includes an hour of education. The education session goes into all aspects of the disease – Depression, Anxiety comes hand in hand with Parkinson. The 3rd hour of the sessions take in whatever allied health care they may need. The first rotation has proved a huge success.

The Third program is Sense Rugby. This is an Occupational Therapy Rugby themed program for children with disabilities with a NDIS funding package for therapy sessions. Sense Rugby happens on a normal rugby field and are run like a normal rugby training session. Tackle bags, pushing, kicking, lining up but there is a lot of focus on the occupational therapy components. Squeezing, rolling, stop, go etc. Tamar has teamed up Tamworth Magpies to create this for the community.

This package is of particular advantage for families with children who have autism. They train every week with qualified child Occupational Therapist's. The sessions are unlike a normal therapy session where some children may resist or may not like to go to. The sessions are fun and majority of children look forward each week to go. They are unaware that this is indeed a therapy session.

Ben relates to one particular boy who came along with his quite burley dad. The boy just sat on the sideline, not getting involved. On week 3 Ben spoke to the dad. He had been playing many years with the Tamworth Magpies. The day had always dreamt that when he had a son, his son would also play with the Tamworth Magpies. His son was diagnosed with autism. Each year dad would buy rugby balls and wany to play with his son. His son is now 10 and was just not interested or responsive to play. His son now pesters dad to go to the park and play ball. The son now looks forward to the rugby sessions.

Maybe you know someone who is floundering at home after cancer treatment or with onset Parkinson's or a family with a child with disability such as autism. These and other programs offered by Tamara may be of benefit to them.
