A new weapon in the fight against polio

A modified polio vaccine, nOPV2, is offering new hope in the fight to eradicate polio. The reengineered formula has a lower risk of causing vaccine-derived poliovirus. This means it is less likely that the weakened strain of poliovirus used in the vaccine will mutate and spur outbreaks in communities where immunization levels are low. The vaccine first rolled out in March 2021. In the first half of 2022, more than 370 million doses have been administered in more than 20 countries. Rotary pledges \$150 million toward polio eradication

Rotary International President Jennifer Jones appeared on the main stage at the star-studded Global Citizen Festival on 24 September to highlight Rotary's commitment to eradicating polio and announce an additional \$150 million pledge toward that end. Jones spoke in front of 60,000 people in New York City and tens of thousands more online and on TV. Learn more about Rotary's most recent pledge in the fight against this disease.

TRC Sustainability Plan

Draft Sustainability Strategy Plan is currently on exhibition which you can view via this link: <u>https://haveyoursay.tamworth.nsw.gov.au/sustainability-strategy</u>

Community survey conducted from Feb 8th to Feb 24th 2022, 664 responses and main concernes identified were; water, waste manageemnt, energy efficiences, waste resue, climate change

- Looks at how concils operations could assist in implementing these goals and similar priorities as the community cam up with but also procurement and resources sources.
- Links back to Blueprint 100
- 8 strategic themes within the document; water, waste, energy, cicular economy, natural environment, transportation and mobility, sustainable governance and climate change mitigation and adaption.
- All areas link with specific teams within council
- Each area has an objective and targets
- Energy focus on reducing councils energy costs which means money can be used elsewhere
- Circular economy 3 parts reuse & upcycle, changing processes to save waste, regenrating the environment. Plus attraticing busineses that have a positive environmental impact.
- Looks at bidiversity retention and environmental loss.
- Looking at EV charging points to assist in certain electric vehicle network.
- Will include the updatin of the Local Environmental Plan and Development Control Plan.
- Fedral Government adapted climat change bill; 43% reduction of Greenhouse Gas emissions by 2030 and net zero by 2050. To meet these requirements TRC has further work to get local data on this.
- Aim to establish a Climate Change Mitigation & Adoption road map.
- At the back of the document, it has an action plan with yearly goals and the directorate/ team responsible.
- Plan links back to the SDG by UN 17 of and each area of the plan links back to these goals which look beyond just the environment but all aspects of sustainability eg. Equality
- Closes for exhibition on 26th October, plese have a look through the document and have your say, provide feedback on the plan. You must submit comments via the link on TRC page.






