QUIRINDI SILO ART PROJECT

WORK HAS STARTED.

How Exciting, it's commenced and all about to happen.

After three and a half years of planning, negotiation, designing and grant applications, work has now started on the Quirindi Silo Art Project, consisting of a Mural and Evening Light Show.

Clearing of the Site has been completed and currently the Silos are being pressure cleaned in preparation for the Artwork to commence.

Testing has already been carried out for the evening Light Show, with further testing to take place in early November

Grants of \$199,981.00 from the NSW Government, \$200,000.00 from the Salvation Army, over \$200,000.00 from the local community in financial or in-kind support and a Rotary District Grant have all brought this dream to life.



The Project, initiated and sponsored by the Quirindi Rotary Club, who have since partnered with the Liverpool Plains Shire Council and GrainCorp, will increase the visitor economy, create a significant tourism and economic boost, encourage new community growth, complement existing mural trails, while improving social cohesion, fostering a sense of pride, and building creative capacity.

Kyle Docherty, Community Engagement Manager with GrainCorp said, "The GrainCorp silos at Quirindi have been a staple landmark for the local community for over 100 years. We're delighted that they'll serve as the canvas for an artwork that represents and celebrates the proud and rich history of the region".

"GrainCorp is committed to growing the Australian Silo Art Trail to draw art lovers and tourists back to regional communities on the east coast of Australia, and Quirindi has certainly earned its place on the trail.

"This project has been a long time in the making and we're so thrilled to work with the Quirindi Silo Art Committee, Rotary Club of Quirindi, Liverpool Plains Shire Council and the talented artist Peter Ryan to finally get the project underway.





"We can't wait to see the final artwork and look forward to celebrating with the community when it's unveiled." said Mr. Docherty.



"Residents will need to keep a close eye on the Silos from now on" said Chairperson of the Silo Art Committee, Ian Carter.

"Projector testing for the light show a few weeks ago, caused great excitement. Our chosen artist, Peter Ryan, will arrive on 25th of October and after a bit of preparation will start the painting! He will be assisted initially by local artist Kate Rutter and then by Melbourne based Keira Sloetjes. What a great opportunity we have to see some very talented artists at work", continued Mr. Carter.









