# Guest Speaker Notes – TAMS, Damion Brown

Tamworth Aboriginal Medical Service

- Started 25 years ago in caravan in Coledale
- Now they have almost outgrown their Marius St premises, Damion has 4 new staff coming on board son and isn't sure where they are going yet.
- They now have an office in Gunnedah and a clinic in Nundle
- TAMS has a huge range of services multi-disciplinary; GPs', womens health, Chronic disease management, Vaccinations, Ears, Skin, they offer transport (so important to ensure people are able to attend appointments)
- 39 staff. 5 Fellows a total of 10 GPs. In 2018, they only had one doctor.
- They are committed to education and training in Health Careers (don't worry, they will hopefully be at Careers Expo next year!).
- Going forward they hope to offer dental services, work in schools, have a purpose built building and community programs plus a whole lot more

There is so much amazing work going on at TAMS. As Michael Smith said, we all know about TAMS but we didn't really know about TAMS.




