

Romania

To put the brakes on dangerous driving, the Rotaract Club of Bistrița Omnia recently partnered with the police and a driving school to set up a car crash simulator at locations in the northern Transylvanian city. "It consists of a driver's seat equipped with a seat belt, fitted on a moving platform that reaches a speed of about 18 mph," says Christian Nistor, immediate past president of the club. "The platform crashes into a stopping bar, simulating the accident." The device was built by the Rotaract Club of Târgu Mureș Téka. Interact and Rotary clubs have also helped with the project. During one simulation event in May, about 200 people were put to the test



simulation event in May, about 200 people were put to the test during the Drive Safely, Choose Life initiative, Nistor says. "Drivers are reminded of the importance of seat belts and the effect of speed in a car crash," he says.





The Rotary Club of Göttingen-Sternwarte teamed up with the Production School Göttingen, a trades-oriented institution for teens, to harvest about 2 tons of apples and turn them into nearly 400 gallons of juice. The Apfelfest project culminated in October 2021 with the juice being donated to elementary schools or sold, raising more than \$3,300 for End Polio Now. "The juice is amazing — a sweet-sour note, pure apple flavors," reports club member Sönke Jaek. "And the dry apple mash was used to feed game such as deer and boar. They loved it." Club members also serve as tutors and assist the students in writing resumes, finding internships, and applying for jobs.





Guest Speaker Notes - Hannah Woods



- •Born in Tamworth in 1996 to Scott & Vicki. I was born at Tamara Private Hospital in the same room my sister Emily was born 3 and a half years later.
- Fun fact, my mum and dad were also born in Tamworth.
- •I have fond memories of my childhood growing up in Tamworth, including adventures on my grandparents property along Back Kooty Rd.
- •At the end of my primary school years my parents brought the property next door to my grandfather and this is where I spent my high school years. They still live there today (ask Louise, I was out raking hay only last week)
- •My high schooling was at McCarthy, and when reaching year 12 I felt I had two paths I could take forensic science or law.
- •Whilst I was hell bent on heading off to Canberra for university, my parents took me on a road trip to all the uni's and this is when I found my place at University of Wollongong. I received entry before my HSC for law and international studies.
- •I moved to Uni in 2014 at the age of 17.5 and lived on college for my first two years. Whilst living here I worked for the university in student recruitment and worked my way up to manage a major part of their early admission program as well as becoming head student representative.
- •I then headed overseas on exchange for my third year of uni at the beginning of 2016. This saw me head off to the south of England to a place called Exeter. I chose this as I had travelled with school to Europe previously and absolutely loved it (fun fact I am also an undercover history buff).
- •Whilst overseas I travelled to approximately 23 different countries and explored as much as I can. Some stand out moments include being at the 100th anniversary Anzac Day celebration in France and being in Paris when the Paris attacks occurred.
- •I headed home toward the end of 2016, much to my families surprise (only mum was in on the secret) and gave my dad the shock of his life (he cried that whole night, very happy I was home and not in Germany like I had said).
- After spending another 6 months in Wollongong, I then headed up to Sydney to live and work whilst I finished my studies.
- •In 2018 when undertaking my legal placement, as a part of my degree, I was offered a position in a law firm where I gladly accepted. The proviso was though that I could still take my planned holidays to both China and Sri Lanka.
- After spending 2 years working at the firm I was then head hunted to manage an allied health paediatrics clinic in the Inner West of Sydney that had Speech Therapists and Occupational Therapists. I love this role and being able to give back to the families we saw.
- •The decision though was made at the end of 2020 to head back home to provide some support to my family, so back to Tamworth I came.
- •I found work with Challenge in their foster care team as a carer compliance officer. I then later moved into their overarching risk and governance team as their risk and compliance administrator. I have very recently taken over management of the team and currently sit on the executive team at Challenge.
- •In my personal life, I have purchase a block of ground to build a house in Kootingal (exciting news is no one can build in front of me due to a reserve so I will always have a view of the valley). I have two very excitable Labradors, Louie and Hugo. I also really value time spent with my family and often spend my weekend helping out on my parents farm.
- •I am really thankful to be a part of rotary as I truely believe rotary are the unsung hero's in Tamworth and want to be a part of such positive change. Thank you to all for welcoming me into First light. I couldn't be prouder to be a part of a club that feels more like a family!
