Just 2 hours of his time each week, over a 20 week period, was what local RAISE mentor, Michael McGregor said made a big difference not just for a young student, but to his life too. Michael is a local RAISE mentor who, along with much loved RAISE coordinator, Jess Barraket spoke with our Club last week about this grass roots mentor program that makes a profound difference in young people's lives.

1 in 4 young people say they feel lonely some or all of the time. It's a hard fact to hear, but local people like Michael who give just 2 hours a week of their time during Terms 2 and 3 are working to change this.

# Guest Speaker – Izaak Ewin

Izaak was born in Dubbo in 1999 and was the son of two teachers, with his parents teaching art and science. He had an outdoorsy childhood, spending a lot of his younger years adventuring a family friends farm in Forbes until he and his family moved to Tamworth on Izaak's 10th birthday.

Following their move, Izaak's sister was diagnosed with BPD and due to this, the family spent a number of years with lots of hospital visits and trips to Sydney.

Izaak told us about his high school years at Carinya where his love of the outdoors was really ignited through programs such as the Duke of Ed program.

Izaak also joined the Tamworth Army cadets in high school. Izaak moved to Farrer in year 11 as a boarder, and told us all a tale of his first moments boarding with other students bringing possums into the dorms. Part way through year 11, Izaak decided that school wasn't the right fit for him and headed off to his first job "man power" a labour job planting trees with the local council and DPI. From here, Izaak started an electrical apprenticeship which he soon worked out wasn't for him before settling into a job at Wests Leagues, the place he has his first exposure to rotary.

Izaak told us of the his decision to go travelling with friends, making it all the way to Bundaberg, before he met a friend in Byron and headed off to Sydney to live. Izaak told us tales of living in Sydney and what an impact living in Newtown had on him, with Izaak noting that it was confronting compared to where he grew up.

At the start of Covid, Izaak made the dash home from Sydney and upon returning sought out his job back at Wests. After heading back into the functions team, Izaak was later promoted to team lead. It was during his time working at Wests that our very own Louise spotted him and informed Izzak that he would be attending RYLA, a program that Izaak stated was the firecracker he needed to work out what he was doing in the future.

Izaak brought us up to life now, explaining that he has completed his pathways to university and has undertaken a new job as an SLSO (teachers aid) at Tamworth High School, a job he very much loves!

Izzak then told us all of his tales from his recent volunteering trip to Fiji where he really lived out Rotary's value of service above self. Izzak coined his time with a lot of learning and developing his understanding of others around the world noting that "over there they have so little but are so grateful for what they have".

Throughout his talk, Izaak showed what a resilient person he is and how he takes on anything that is

thrown his way with a "why not, let's give it a go" attitude!!


























## Rostered Duties and Definitions

Select the Table Order (after the head table).

#### Need to be in attendance by 6.30 am

#### DOOR TEAM

To record the attendance of our members and guests, collect meeting dues, and if possible balance the cash float i.e. monies paid = money received.

#### Need to be in attendance at 6.30 am

#### MEETER & GREETER

To meet and greet our members & welcome guests to our Club and to hand name badges to members. Also ensue any guests of members or visiting Rotarians are introduced to the Visitor Assist to ensure they are made welcome.

#### Need to be in attendance at 6.30 am

#### VISITOR ASSIST

To ensure any visitors to the Club are felt welcome by introducing yourself to them and other members and guests of our Club. Try to ensure they are introduced to the President prior to sitting as well. To also include them in fellowship before and if necessary make sure they are included with several members for breakfast and are <u>never</u> left on their own.

#### Need to be in attendance from 6.30 am

#### WELCOME

To publicly welcome our Members and Guests (following the introduction) to our meeting when called upon by the President or their substitute.

#### Need to be in attendance by 6.50 am (or earlier)

#### INTRODUCTION

To make yourself known to our Guest Speaker/s, assist them to the head table and sit with them. During breakfast find out some information about the guest speaker which will assist you in your introduction.

#### NOTE TAKER

It is your job to make notes on the meeting to assist the Bulletin editor. Guest speakers usually have written notes of their talk, so try to get them before they disappear.

#### VOTE OF THANKS

To move a vote of thanks to our guest speaker, and present a little thank you gift which can be found in our cabinet left of the stage. Ensure you have it before the meeting commences and take notes during their presentation to ensure your thank you is informed.
