Rotary responds to earthquake in Turkey, Syria

Turkey and Syria were struck by a devastating earthquake on 6 February that has killed tens of thousands of people, destroyed thousands of homes and other structures, and left people across the region without shelter in bitterly cold winter weather. The Rotary world responded to this catastrophe immediately. Rotary leadership has activated our disaster response efforts, communicated with the affected districts, and encouraged governors in those regions to apply for disaster response grants. In addition, our project partner ShelterBox and service partner Habitat for Humanity are working on their responses. Find out how you can have the greatest impact.

Australian Soil Management: Australian Carbon Credit Units

Norman Marshall and Greg Bender started Australian Soil Management (ASM) have conducted many research activities. One of their research projects led them to determine the effect of compost on soil carbon. It is during that time that they were approach by many farmers, concerned with the lack of integrity of most company registering Australian Carbon Credit Units (ACCUs). The ACCUs are a commodity and they have a dollar value. Australia is the only country in the world that provide carbon credits for increase in soil carbon. Once issued, how they are used and sold is important. The current price is at \$40 per ACCUs. A 1000 ha farm can potentially



generate \$5 million dollars. And at a \$100 value, there is a potential for \$10 million. Where will the price be in 10 years? The current price in Europe is 80euros or \$100 AUD and within the next 5 years, international trading will open and it is possible that ACCUs will trade at that price and higher. Furthermore, Australian credits are based on measurement, not modelling and will fetch the highest price. This translates to a substantial additional revenue for farmers, particularly, graziers. Suddenly, how they manage their soils becomes very important.


What is the future? This is only the start. Last year, the Federal Government introduced biodiversity credits. A program is coming from the Federal Government that will enable farmers to have carbon credits for their soils and if they add a biodiversity protection program. They will be able to claim other carbon credits. Degraded land can also be eligible, if they are being repaired. This means that every bit of a farm is now valuable. If you are adding long term conservation to your land title, the amount of money will be substantial.

Another aspect of increasing soil carbon is productivity. A 1% increase in soil carbon equates to a 30% increase in productivity. Farmers will have the option to package different credits, so long as they collaborate with the right provider and make sure the project is registered under their names.
