GUEST SPEAKER – ANZAC DAY-WO2 AARON BARNES 12/16 HUNTER RIVER LANCERS



Our club was grateful for a presentation from Warrant Officer Class 2 (WO2), Aaron Barnes, Operations Warrant Officer, and Recruiting Officer for 12/16 Hunter River Lancers.

Aaron mentioned his early life as a student, which progressed towards a desire to be a pilot in the RAAF, then a pilot in the Navy, and finally, a start in the army reserves.

Aarons life in the military has been distinguished and varied, with a number of postings, deployments, and life and experiences gained throughout his 24 years in the Australian Army. Notable mentions were of the changes seen in the countries in which he served over the years, such as training of local forces, plus changes in warfare and weaponry as the war progressed over the years- one example being the design of IED's. The robustness of the Australian Bushmaster vehicles which saw service was mentioned— the division suffered a loss of 13 vehicles in a single deployment, thankfully, with only minimal injury to our soldiers (a few broken bones) as a result.

Some notable moments include peacekeeping in East Timor, deployment to Iraq, and a range of roles in the armoured division on the army supporting our troops in their mission.

More recently, WO2 Barnes was posted to Puckapunyal, Townsville and Brisbane, making the move to Tamworth 3 years ago where his role is involved in the recruitment and training of soldiers throughout a number of courses.

Through Peter Ryan, our Club thanked WO2 Aaron Barnes for his service to his country, and thanked him on a personal level for sharing his experiences in our armed forces with us- which has proved to be a very interesting and continuing career, with a lot of interesting stories that could span many, many hours.











