## **Guest Speaker**:

#### **Member Personal Profile - Charlotte Moore**

RCTFL heard from one of our newest members, Charlotte Moore, giving the club her personal profile- and a glimpse into her many achievements to date.

Charlotte grew up in Port Macquarie, with her parents and younger brother. Her youth was spent dancing, playing sport and attending music lessons, and the associated training, eisteddfods and matches. Charlotte recounted that the hard work of her parents afforded her these opportunities in life, and her drive to take every available opportunity that comes her way, and work ethic was instilled in her from these experiences.

At 13, her interest in volunteering developed, notably with some time spent in the local surf lifesaving club. This grew into some school based initiatives, such as a cultural immersion program in the Solomon islands helping to build classrooms in Visale Village.

Charlottes exposure to Rotary started with a National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) event in year 12 (2018) held in Canberra. The selection process was involved, with Port Macquarie Youth Director Diana Gammon being instrumental in the process, and Charlotte's lifeline back to Rotary over the years to come. NYSF brought some realisation and some challenges – Engineering was not her preferred career path, but a taste of the sports laboratory was the start of an interest in physiology and science, which progressed into a place in a Bachelors degree in Sport and Exercise Science at UTS the following year. – But not before a gap year working in the UK at a prestigious private school in Oxford.

Like every great life story, COVID happened in 2020, in the start of 1<sup>st</sup> year university- meaning that the shuffle between Port Macquarie and UTS Sydney happened multiple times amidst university opening, closing, lockdowns, protests etc. The fun we all remember. Charlotte finished her studies in 2022, and Graduated recently with Distinction.

Amongst a full time study workload, and 2 part time jobs, Charlotte was approached by Diana Gammon to attend RYLA, which she at first declined. Thankfully, Diana's persistence resulted in Charlotte attending in 2021, and returning in 2022 as a leader- by her own admission, Charlotte says this changed her life in so many ways.

Post Ryla, and on the final year of her Bachelors degree, Charlotte and other Port Macquarie RYLArians started a young leaders Rotary club, and subsequently chartered and handed over to the members. The club has sponsored 2 RYLA participants, 2 RYPEN participants.

Charlotte commenced work at 360 fitness club Tamworth, as an accredited exercise scientist. She specialises in adolescents, athletes and strength conditioning, and some members jokingly expressed interest in geriatric training programs during the meeting. Your editor is of the strong belief that anything is possible, and despite the age of some of our members, exercise is always a great pastime to get involved in. Charlotte has developed a program for sport performance for highschool students, which is being well received by the Tamworth community.

Currently, Charlotte has commenced further education in a masters of Teaching (Secondary), majoring in PDHPE and Mathematics.

Huge thanks to Charlotte for telling us your story, and we look forward to seeing you grow in your career, and your Rotary club here in Tamworth.







# Funny Corner
