### BONUS CONTENT-AN INTERVIEW WITH OUR YOUTH EXCHANGE STUDENT MACIEJ WOLANSKI

After a late change to our guest speaker roster, we thought we'd have a quick chat with Maciej as a 'getting to know you'. Despite it potentially being a daunting task – talking in a new country, in a different language, and to a room full of Rotarians- Maciej really shone as a gifted public speaker and performer. The interview below was hosted by Hannah Woods and paraphrased by your editor.

### Where are you from?

Maciej lives in Poland, a European country located to the East of Germany, to the west of Ukraine, and south of Sweden, with the Baltic Sea in between. To the south of Poland, is Czechia, and Slovakia.

### Home life

Maciej has a big family of 6. His parents, plus three siblings. Two sisters- 1 is older and is a lawyer. The other sister attends high school. His brother is older and is studying at university. They also have a dog, a big white dog of which the breed is not easy to translate.

### Why did you consider the Youth Exchange Program (YEP?)

Maciej was exposed to the YEP through a discussion with his brother in law's sister- who did an exchange in the precovid times. Unfortunately, her exchange was cut short due to the pandemic, but nevertheless, the experience she had was favourable.

### Why Australia?

Despite the unfortunate fact (for us) that Australia is not the hot topic of daily Polish conversations (except for when we compete in the Eurovision contest), our country was recommended to Maciej by his sister. His sister was involved in a shorter exchange program via her university during her law degree and came highly recommended. It was described as having "good people, and a good country".

#### Interests etc

Maciej is studying in year 11 at Calrossy school. His favourite subject is Music, which is a passion of his, as we will further explore later in the interview.

His other favourite subjects are Chemistry and Biology- which he feels he is very competent in back at home, but the language barrier for technical aspects of the course does make study in the English language a bit more difficult.

Academically, Maciej aspires to study medicine. He feels that line of work would be a valuable career, and a god way to help people.

### **Sports and Hobbies**

Our newest member is a bit of a extreme sports daredevil! He enjoys a range of sports such as climbing/bouldering, Handball, Soccer, and snowboarding. But his favourite two sports are tennis and Windsurfing.

Windsurfing is not a very common sport in Poland, but there is a dedicated few who windsurf in the Baltic Sea, but most enjoy this sport on a nearby lake, on the Shores of Hel. Maciej told us of a local bus route which goes from Dansk to Hel, with the route 666- a strange coincidence which has since been changed. We were assured that Hel is a nice place to visit, although your editor does wonder if it does in fact ever freeze over (if it does, I have a few promises made to me that I'd be able to collect on!)

Maciej has been able to see a little bit of Australia in his first few weeks of being here. A recent trip to 'the bush' saw him visit a lake, which by Australian standards was cold... but for a Pole, it was almost perfect swimming conditions!

#### **Interest in Music**

We are fortunate to have a competent musician visiting us on YEP. While performing at our country music festival is still 'under consideration', Maciej has a solid history of playing multiple instruments and performing at various events back home.

He is a pianist, having had many lessons, and progressed to a level where he has played in a band back home. More recently he started playing guitar, and is so far, self-taught. Interestingly, this coming week will mark his first ever guitar lesson, and to gear up for this, he has purchased a guitar locally to help him on his journey. Maciej enjoys playing and composing music, particularly as a method of relaxing when needed.

### **Prior Expectations of Australia**

As discussed, Maciej was told lots about Australia following his sister's short university exchange. As is the trend, Australia was expected to have a plethora of spiders, snakes, and other creatures just waiting to eat unsuspecting visitors. Thankfully, an encounter with a drop-bear ahs not yet been experienced.

On a more serious note, Maciej has a open mind to his exchange in Australia, and look forward to improving his English, forging some new friendships, and making some unforgettable memories (they must train them on these PR skills before they send them over – ed).

Maciej really wants to get an Australian accent while here- and I'm sure his school mates will really enjoy telling him all the slang and lingo of the contemporary Australian teenager.
