

#### **GUEST SPEAKER – THE WHITE ELEPHANT BALL**

#### BATYR AUSTRALIA- HELPING TO CREATE A WORLD WHERE ALL YOUNG PEOPLE LEAD MENTALLY HEALTHY AND FULFILLING LIVES.

Sue O'Connor writes about our guest speaker's presentation.

Jess Barber is an exercise physiologist at 360 Fitness Club who grew up in Quirindi. Breanna McFadyen is a PDH and dance teacher at Oxley HS who recently choreographed the dance groups for Capers. She grew up in Armidale. These ladies are involved in organising the White Elephant Ball in Tamworth each year as a fundraiser for Batyr.

Local Tamworth lady, Katrina Campbell, sadly lost her husband Scotty when he took his own life in 2013. Determined to break the stigma around mental health and suicide in the bush, she decided to help raise funds for Batyr by forming a committee to run the inaugural White Elephant Ball in 2014. With the \$90,000 raised, a rural Batyr co-ordinator was able to be funded.



Batyr is an organisation that supports university and school students by running programs that reduce the stigma associated with mental ill health and increase the support seeking rate of young people. Batyr was founded by Sebastian Robertson in 2010 after he had battled with mental illness while he was at university. Suicide is the leading cause of death in young people aged between 15 and 44 in Australia and Batyr aims to address this issue.

Mental health is a serious issue in regional areas such as Tamworth, and across Australia. Of every 30 students in Australia, 7 will be dealing with a mental health issue, yet only 2 will reach out for support, leaving 5 suffering in silence.

With the funds raised, Batyr has implemented 120 programs, known as "batyr@school", in schools across the New England and North West regions. These programs aim to normalise conversations about mental health, arming students with the skills to cope with their fluctuating emotions, especially how to reach out to others and who to reach out to. 80% of students reported the benefits of hearing others share their experiences.

In its 9th year, this year's very successful ball was held on 14th October in the Town Hall and had 410 guests. With



the support of many local businesses, over \$83,000 was raised to continue to support the vital work of Batyr. The White Lunch, a curtainraiser for the ball, was held earlier in the year.

Thank you to Jess and Bree for a very engaging presentation. The high level of interest was reflected in Question Time where there was discussion about the mental health issues in young people that relate to media, especially social media, and also to issues with body image.

Thank you to Jess and Bree for all that you do for this important cause.
