GUEST SPEAKER - JERMAIN WALFORD

Our Guest Speaker today was Jermain Walford, past RYLA'rian (2022) and RYLA Leader (2023).

Jermain spoke of his life and how he got to where he is today.

Jermain is 25 years young and was born in Dubbo. Starting out life was tough with exposure to drugs and alcohol in the household being the "norm" and not knowing the truth about his biological father. Jermain was raised to believe that his stepfather was his real father which also contributed to the



trauma in his life when the truth came out. At the age of 4, Jermain moved to Tamworth and was struggling with his identity, and it was a difficult time with his mother.

When Jermain went to school it became a big part of his life as he was away from the home environment and Hillvue Public School became a big part of his life where he meet lifelong friends and was introduced to sports and fitness which offered an alternate to the home situation. As Jermain transitioned to high school he found out his real identity which did little to relieve the toxic household he was in. Jermain spoke about the domestic violence in the house and that often he would receive the punishment for his siblings.

A positive through this time was meeting his partner, Tshinta.

Jermain spoke of his passions in life:

Dance – enjoyed dancing in all forms and spent many hours doing the moves of Michael Jackson, although now reserves this for select times. Jermain also like to dance with his brother who sadly passed away 5 years ago and thinks often about those missed opportunities.

Poetry – Jermain likes to write poems when he has the chance as a way of getting feelings out.

Touch Football – After receiving an acquired brain injury in 2013 – 14 while playing 1st grade rugby league for the Oxley Diggers in Tamworth he received a head knock causing a bleed on the brain he found he could no longer play contact sport. The transition to Touch Football was a simple one as the codes are very similar but no contact or kicking involved. This has led to being involved in a lot of teams including Dreamtime Touch and the Tamworth Titans. This period of time also made Jermain stronger and has allowed him to deal with issues such as depression and anxiety better.

Coaching – Jermain is really passionate about coaching and mentoring young people in a team environment and believes that it is more than sport orientated but a way to encourage young people to open up and feel safe to talk about how they feel while participating is a physical activity. Bring out everyone's potential to work as part of a team.

Things that have changed Jermain's perspective:

RYLA – This activity has changed Jermain's life, and the support of our Rotary Club through the Terry Burgess Memorial Scholarship made all the difference. With Louise's constant badgering to get to the camp, it is one of the things that has made so many changes in his life. He went to the camp with the mantra of "Make your bed", if you make your bed in the morning, you have achieved one goal for the day and prompts you to look for more goals to start and finish each day.

DreamTime Touch – Jermain has set up the Dreamtime Touch program to help mentor young people with mental health struggles and get them involved in a team activity. Dreamtime Touch was also set up to honour and remember his brother. Jermain acknowledged the support of our Rotary Club and in particular Dennis, Louise, Richard and Peter for their ongoing support and guidance to see the team succeed.

Jermain was also nominated for a number of local sporting awards and was successful in Coach of the year and Local Achiever of the Year categories. This is something Jermain was not looking to receive recognition in bit was very humble (NOT) in receive the honours.





Jermain works at Healthwise within the Indigenous Mental Health Unit. Jermain works with different people in the community such as the homeless and people struggling with mental health issues and provides supports and interventions so that they can begin to function again in the community. Prior to this Jermain was a teachers Aide at Tamworth South Public School and worked with the difficult kids and worked on encouraging better behaviours such as attendance and the benefits of school for things like friends and sport.

Jermain would like to continue in supporting youth with the challenges of mental health issues and feels



that it "Ain't weak to speak" when dealing with mental health and that there should be more awareness out there. Jermain is making this a main focus of the DreamTime Touch message and feels that we all need to support each other as he has lost mates to suicide, and it may have not happened if there was someone to talk to.


