RYLA IS A POWERFUL AND VALUABLE LEADERSHIP PROGRAM DESIGNED TO ENCOURAGE AND DEVELOP SKILLS THAT PARTICIPANTS CAN POSITIVELY CONTRIBUTE TO THEIR COMMUNITIES.

The objective of RYLA is to empower participants with self-awareness, confidence and leadership skills to assist them in becoming more effective leaders. Many former RYLA Awardees have benefited in ways far beyond the course objective. Past RYLArians are part of the Leadership team and many go on to become more involved in community activities.

The program provides skills in many areas including understanding human behaviour, social interaction skills, committee functions, human values, leadership, presentation skills & public speaking, lifestyle issues, communication and organisation.

Participants must be 19 - 27 years of age and ideally involved in some form of leadership within their communities, or have shown leadership potential in the workplace. Other relevant information is in the application form found on the website. Potential candidates will be formally interviewed as part of the selection process and must undergo a formal screening process, which will include reference checks.

GUEST SPEAKER – OUR OWN – MACIEJ 'MAGIC' WOLANSKI

Everyone's favourite Exchange student from Poland gave us an 'amazing' talk this week on his first 6months in Australia.

Your editor thought that the travel schedule of the rich and famous, or a rockstar like Taylor Swift was pretty hectic... but it appears the life of an exchange student is not too dissimilar!

Maciej, or 'Magic' as we have named him, has seen so much of Australia so far, and is looking forward to more adventures to come over the remaining months of his exchange.

Early on, a trip to Brisbane for some sightseeing saw a visit to the Australia Zoo, where he was able to hold a koala, feed a kangaroo, and watched a demonstration of Robert Irwin feeding a crocodile. It was also combined with a visit with his host family visiting their friend, Blake.

His Australian school experience sees him attend Calrossy, where he proudly wears his "Polish Boy" emblazoned jersey, as is the trend with year 11 and 12 students in these modern times. Bussin' drip, no cap!

Other school experiences include involvement with the school choir, and concerts, where his guitar playing sees him centre-stage. John Fogarty has nothing on Magic's version of 'Heard it through the grapevine', while Video footage emerged of a superbly choreographed dance, alongside a top-class vocal rendition of the Neo-classical Mexican folk classic "Tequila" was what could only be described as a 'show-stopper'. What amazing talent.

It doesn't stop there though- the skill and prowess of our Magic is without bounds (as he will surely tell you, if you listen long enough) – other A-grade experiences include:

- Water skiing at Lake Keepit allegedly "just like snow skiing" despite the 1 ski, flat surface, and water being in it's liquid state.
- **Surfing at Port Stephens** As an avid windsurfer, surfing without the wind was a Breeze for Magic. So much so that his group lessons morphed into a series of private lessons, as he was so far advanced.
- **Golfing** The tendrils of our club's golfers have worked their way around Magic, with a brief foray into golf. He developed a superb swing, and decided to give it away before he embarrassed some of our members who have been trying to play for years...
- Ice Skating at the Big Banana, Coffs Harbour- Magic was amazed to find out that one can go ice skating in tropical NSW, going so far as to say "It's Bananas!". Being able to scoot around the ice rink in shorts and a T-shirt, while working up a sweat in our Australian temps, was a new experience, but nevertheless, one he also excelled at.

Other notable experiences invluced a trip to Gunnedah to meet outbound YEP students, where he was sympathetic to the feelings and emotions that they were going through, just lik he did just months prior. One particular fear was leaving Poland to come to Australia amongst all the snakes, spiders, and other creepy-crawlies we have here. He met with Emily, and Australian who is going to Poland on exchange- Magic's family will be hosting her there later in the year- how cool is that?!

Work experience on the farm – Magic spent some time farming, helping RCTFL member James "Rolling grass" – Turf that is – a great exposure to the agricultural interests of the Tamworth region.

Over Christmas Magic experienced the differences between a Northern and Southern hemisphere Christmas. This was in part spentin Terrigal at a beachside apartment, with activities like swimming, and body surfing.

The 'party' continued into NYE, with a trip to Sydney to watch the fireworks over the harbour. I also believe a tennis match was watched at the same time.

Tamwqorth country music festival was a highlight for Magic, and his YEP cohort, with plenty of time spent at the pub, roaming the streets, and watching gigs- all within the confines of the YEP rulebook, of course. Magic was also able to volunteer at the lego masters event, as well as helping to raise some money for the Cancer Council at the ABCRA rodeo at the AELEC.

Magic has offered us all a huge thanks for making his exchange so memorable so far. He has really enjoyed his experiences, and his exposure to our country, Australia. Magic was thanked for his presentation, in Polish, by Brett white. Words by your editor.
