

Guest Speaker - Jamie Hunt

Here is 'this is your life' Jamie Hunt

Born 1989 QE2 jubilee hospital Cooper's plains Support Broncos & QLD but don't follow the football Moved to TW ripe old age of 1 Eldest of 3 children to Bill and Rae Hunt.

Attended Tamworth South Public School

I was in Cub Scouts and a scout.

Introduced to some community service and some life skills, and camping. Learnt about yowies and general bushcraft.

Narrabri great raft race 1st place with my team, Scout's community service job week.

Cub scout of the year 1995

Myself and one other first in South Tamworth Cub Scout group to obtain yellow cord - challenges, community service, knot tying etc.

Became an assistant den leader in my scout pack.

Tamworth High School.

Studied subjects that were to direct me towards becoming an architect, until I completed some work experience in an architectural firm and decided that although I loved the work, I didn't want to go to 'school again for another 6 years just to be trapped sitting down at a desk.

Despite derailing a little in my ambition, I completed year 12 and started a traineeship on TRC as a water then wastewater trainee which saw me involved in Treating the town's water, climbing reservoirs, looking after dungowan dam, amongst many other tasks.

I eventually took up a position of wastewater operator and resided on council for a total of 10.5 years, during which I developed a passion for water and wastewater, whilst concurrently getting bored with my job.

Then came along the opportunity to begin studying engineering part-time which was full circle back against what I was not initially keen on doing - stuck at uni!

This would be a 10 year journey as I nearly finished my associate degree, and transferred to a bachelor's degree majoring in civil - loosing some courses.

I got bored of some of the courses being offered in civil engineering, and changed to environmental major, which I lost some courses again.

During this period of study some major things happened to me which were pivotal in my recent character development - I attended RYLA in 2015, then again in 2016 as a leader, I began dating my wife Morgan, through circumstances I lost my job on council and then started at Teys abattoir as a blood cooker for 2 years before becoming the site's project manager where my water and wastewater passion is fulfilled and also expanded my professional passion interests, then finally the birth of the stars of my life - my now 5 year old Son Callum and 2 year old daughter Amelia.

Having had a few attempts at a few sports as a kid, I never really got into my of them. Began learning pipes at age 10. Dad gauged interest on banjos, took us to see Pixie Jenkins to see if violin was our thing. Being Scottish he knew band members who encouraged him to bring my brother and I along, which we were both interested in.

Gained a lot on confidence and social skills, and mathematical skills learning the pipes under the tuition of Robert McKenzie.

Piping quickly became a large part of my life, my brother learnt also then later on my sister learnt the tenor drum.

I began competing in solo competitions.

I Played with Sydney pipe bands

I have played in the world pipe band championships in 2006 city of Blacktown G4, 2010 Hawkesbury & Nepean valley pipe band G3, 2015 pipe band club G2 (dropped) and 2024 as pipe major of the NSW Highlanders G4.

I have played for John Farnham himself a few times, and in many rock bands to perform You're the Voice and Long Way to the Top.

I am the pipe major of the Tamworth pipe band, and also the NSW Highlanders who are a conglomerate of players who's home bands don't compete, but they have the desire to experience competition around Australia and the world to become better players.

I'll be heading to the 120th MacLean highland gathering this Easter for the 22nd time in 26 years of playing bagpipes to lead both of these bands into competition.




