Guest Speaker - Cody Wilson

Cody spent 12 months as a Rotary Youth Exchange Student from January 2024 to Janaury 2025 in Japan.

Since returning, Cody has been running his own business and is the Treasurer of the Interact Club we sponsor. Cody is a member of the Youth Council and the newly formed ROTEX - Golden Wattle Rotex D9660. He hasn't really stopped since returning to Australia. Cody is a valued member of our community and a budding enthusiast of Rotary

Thanks to Brian Logan for the following notes:

Today's guest speaker and 'Interact member' Cody Wilson, gave us a rapid fire talk on his experience as an Exchange Student in Japan.My ability as the Bulletin note taker is impaired by my age, slowness of comprehension and lack of technical acumen thus, I can only express to you what I (and maybe others) have experienced from today's education. It went something like this.

I went to Japan and 'oh no, tech problems' as an exchange student, 'hang on...selfie' stayed at 'stop, start again, Peter, can you help. Oh, it's a short cable and Oh...Selfie.' Nara, a place in country Japan with a population of about 300,000. Hang on...Selfie...Oh, can't swoosh the slides, 'Peter can you help'. The school has about 40 students to a class and I did Kendo as a sport. 'Selfie'. Oh, I need a stick selfie for this. The school seemed so animated, outdated and they still used chalk boards.





Guest Speaker - Cody Wilson

We went to Tokyo on a bullet train and to see the Interactive Museum 'check...selfie' and the horse restaurant (no horses sitting inside) and the meat tasted a little different. There were 60 to 70 exchange students. 'Selfie' (with no horses). We then went on to Mount Fuji (more selfies) and did a 2 day climb. We slept on the side of the mountain. By this time, I had a selfie stick, Kando stick, Fuji stick and mud won't stick. (no selfie.) Roll over, Roll over...seven to the bed (definitely no selfies) Can you see the slides now? Oh no, flat battery. Maybe, a selfie with me and my moustache will help. No... got to shave it off as the girls don't like it and won't kiss me.

Meanwhile, back in Nara, the local Nara deer are a somewhat 'protected' species with a local tradition of being the town alarm clock. The first town resident to wake in the morning gets to slaughter the deer and leave it on some ones doorstep. It can be passed around until the last person rises to find the slaughtered animal and that they are the last to rise and the subject of taunting.

Now, to gain some perspective of the presentation, if you made sense of it, well done. I am left wondering what the outbound applicant (Hector) thought of it.




