Aim of RYLA:

- To demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth
- To encourage continued and stronger leadership of youth by youth
- To provide leadership training experience for young people to assist them to be actively and effectively involved with their communities and their work place.

RYLA commenced in District 9650 in 1970 and is conducted annually with participants sponsored through their local clubs or their employers. It is a very powerful and valuable program and is aimed at encouraging and developing leadership and social skills so that participants can more effectively

contribute to their communities in a practical manner. The program is designed to encourage leadership of youth, by youth. Typically these young people come from groups such as sporting clubs, voluntary emergency services, scouting, guiding, church groups, youth mentoring programs or sponsored by their employer and will be at least 19 years of age and under 27 years of age at the time of RYLA.
